	SUBJECT: PORT OPERATION	IS OUARTER	LY ACTIVITY REPORT	

Marina operations activity during 3rd quarter of 2019:

- <u>Launch</u> When comparing 3rd quarter 2018 to 3rd quarter 2019, the number of round-trip launches were down by 1% or 14 less round-trips. One-ways were up by 35%, or 72 more one-ways. Some of this shift from roundtrips to one-ways is due to an operational efficiency change made in the way that we charge out Jacobsen's launches. Fishing opportunities in Area 9 and Area 10 were very good this year.
- Guest Moorage We had visits from 1914 boats that stayed for a total of 3167 nights. Also, we limited group reservations to maximum of 5 boats so that we could accommodate the high demand for guest moorage from visitors and fishing activity. 1 group made up the 2 boats that stayed 4 nights in guest moorage during 3rd quarter. Loan-a-slips were in short supply, but high demand compared to previous years. There were 57 loan-a-slip spaces during 3rd quarter 2019 as compared to 78 spaces in 3rd quarter 2018. But those 57 spaces had 999 nights of use as compared to 628 nights of use in 2018.
- <u>Fuel Dock</u> prices were down by 5% on unleaded and down by 7% on diesel at 3rd quarter end 2019 compared to 3rd quarter end 2018. Total gallons pumped increased by \$0.27% or 555 gallons more than in 3rd quarter 2018. Gasoline decreased by 611 gallons or (-1%) and diesel increased by 56 gallons.
- Travelift & Boatyard days are down by 58 days or 9% in 3rd quarter 2019 compared to 3rd quarter 2018. Sling time pressure wash numbers remained the same in 3rd quarter 2019 compared to 3rd quarter 2018. Sling time with no wash was up by 53% or 17 boats compared to 3rd quarter 2018.

Moorage and Dry Storage:

- In water moorage terminations decreased from 34 in 3rd quarter 2018 to 33 in 3rd quarter 2019. Turnover ratio decreased from 5.13% in 3rd quarter 2018 to 4.98% in 3rd quarter 2019.
- Waitlist remained constant at 134 names.
- In dry storage terminations increased from 20 in 3rd quarter 2018 to 25 in 3rd quarter 2019. Turnover ratio increased from 8.6% in 3rd quarter 2018 to 10.73% in 3rd quarter 2019.
- New dock protocols, new hours, new amenities, and new "pay-per-move" offered in Dry storage this year.
- 2nd season of dock protocols received very positive feedback from dry storage customers
- Due to low demand from customers (6 to 7 moves between 5am and 7am) for launching before 7am, low daylight levels and noise complaints from neighbors, operations made a decision to open at 7am on weekdays during Chinook opening this year and 6am on weekends, instead of the 5am daily opening during 2018's Chinook opener.
- Total boat handling moves by the forklifts for this quarter was 5665. This is about 12% less than 3rd quarter 2018.
- Call ahead service was up by 51% over 3rd quarter 2018. While customers at the facility always received service first, voice mail requests became difficult to respond to. New cell phone in dry storage allowed staff to implement a texting service which is less time consuming for operators and more convenient for many customers.

EVENTS/TRAINING

- Seasonal staff training ongoing throughout 3rd quarter 2019.
- Snohomish County Fire District No. 1 provided fire extinguisher training to Port staff on September 26, 2018.
- Edmonds Coho Derby returned on September 7, 2019.
- Everett Coho Derby had two weigh stations in Edmonds on September 21 and 22, 2019
- Sea Jazz ended on September 4, 2019.
